NEW ICEJ SPEAKER SERIES

Stay tuned for additional information on ICEJ's new speaker series, where we will be inviting speakers to discuss various environmental issues. Our first will be with Dr. Aaron Gross.

ICEJ will be hosting a series of online presentations over the course of this year. For our first, Dr. Aaron Gross of the University of San Diego will discuss the broad relationship between current animal agricultural practices and human pandemics-- specifically how industrial farming substantially increases the risk of another zoonotic (animal to human) pandemic. COVID was of course not caused by industrial farming, but Dr. Gross worries that unless we change these practices, more pandemics are likely in our future.

We have not yet set the exact date for Dr. Gross' presentation, so stay tuned--we will get the word out shortly.
